

OER Evaluation Checklist

Accuracy

- Is the information accurate? Are there major content errors or omissions?
- Are there spelling errors or typos?
- Has the material been peer reviewed?

Accessibility

- Is the resource available in alternative formats (e.g. .doc or .odf)?
- For audio or video resources, is there a transcript or subtitles?

Production Quality

- Is the information clear and understandable?
- Is the layout and interface easy to navigate?
- Do the design features enhance learning?
- For multimedia resources, are the audio/video quality high?

Relevance

- Does the information directly address one or more of the class objectives?

Licensing

- Does the license allow for educational reuse of the materials?
- Does the license allow modifications or adaptations of the materials? If so, can you
- modify the resource to better fit the class objectives or encourage active learning?
